Students learning science through music

Fairview Elementary School students are learning about matters scientific through the medium of music this week.

It's all thanks to artist in residence Peter Lenton, who has brought his background in music, theatre and science to the Red Deer school.

"Basically what I am doing is using my experience as a former teacher and curriculum specialist, and biologist," said Lenton.

He is in the process of moving his base from Calgary to Edmonton, he said. He got his education in Ontario.

Lenton started out as a biologist before moving to teaching, but always maintained a lively interest in the arts, particularly music.

Towards the end of his time with the Calgary school board, Lenton dreamed up the idea of teaching science through the media of music, theatre and language arts.

Now he runs his own company and is known professionally as Peter Puffin.

Lenton, aka Puffin, said it's great having a whole week at Fairview Elementary School, enabling him to work with the individual classrooms.

He also gives single workshops and concerts and has a couple of albums out.

The most recent, Passengers, features songs that encourage environmental stewardship.

Before he goes to a school, Lenton surveys the teachers, he said, then plans activities to complement what they are working on with their students.

"A huge part of it is self-esteem building, community building," said


